Robert Edgar Fisher II, 78, peacefully passed away at his home in Herriman, UT, on April 9, 2022 after a 21 year battle with Parkinson's Disease. He was born on Thanksgiving Day, November 25, 1943 in Lansing, MI, to Robert Edgar Fisher and Marian Azalea (Dickerson) Fisher who were students at Michigan State University. On September 30, 1972 he married his best friend, Linda (Radke) Fisher. They went on to have 4 lovely children and 17 wonderful grandchildren.

He never met a computer he didn't like. He always kept up with the latest technology. His engineering prowess was adept at fixing anything mechanical or electrical. His lifelong career was with the United States Postal Service including being a Plant Manager and an Industrial Engineer. He loved spending time with his family. He was willing to go along with any adventure his wife planned such as canoeing, camping, sailing, traveling, white water rafting, biking, cross country skiing, golfing, etc.

He was a great example to others of patience, long suffering, loyalty, wisdom, and humor. His legacy lives on through his posterity.
