Ron Lewis Beesley, age 83, passed away August 27, 2021 in Murray, Utah. He was born September 3, 1937 in Salt Lake City to William Noall and Barbara Clair Beesley. He has been married to his sweetheart Vera Larisch Beesley for 58 years (solemnized in the Salt Lake Temple, June 17, 1963).
