Rosella H Arnold passed peacefully on April 14th, 2022, in the presence of family members at the age of 91 in Murray Utah. She was born in Ault Colorado on November 20th, 1930. She moved with her family to Fruita Colorado when she was 7 years old. She attended school in Fruita Colorado and graduated from Fruita Monument High School in 1949. She attended college at Colorado State University in Fort Collins, Colorado.

Rosella was first married to Duane J Diefenderfer in January of 1951. They had three children, Carla K in July of 1951, James Craig in July of 1954, and Melinda Sue in April of 1957. She also gained a lifelong Brother-In-Law, John (Fender) Diefenderfer.
