After 10 years in California, they moved to Utah where they added two more children, Lee and D.J., to the family tree.

Ruth is the perfect example of unconditional love and beauty emanating from within that will be forever missed. She loved her children and grandkids so much! Anytime one of her loved ones was feeling sad and down she would say "Hakuna Matata" which means "no worries" which is what she would want everyone to know at her passing.
