Shirley Jean Turner Dunn passed away on December 31, 2020 at the age of 87 due to Covid-19 complications.

Shirley's greatest joy was spending time with her children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. Her grandchildren looked forward to the delicious meals she cooked, the Christmas parties she hosted, and her yearly cousin sleepovers. Every grandchild knew that Grandma would always provide a listening ear, offer kind advice, share a safe place to stay and prepare a delicious sandwich made with love. Shirley was admired for her strong and unwavering faith in the Plan of Salvation and love for her Savior. Prior to death, she shared her great desire to return home to her Heavenly Father and to reunite with her husband, parents, and family members. Her last wish, prior to passing, was for her family to love more every day and to be kinder every day.
