Stanley Levern Morgan, a beloved husband, father, grandfather, great grandfather, military veteran, and pillar of his church community, passed away peacefully on August 15, 2024, at the age of 89.

Born in Richville, Utah, on March 24, 1935, to Leonard Levern Morgan and Katie Watts Morgan, Stan built his life around serving others. He proudly served his country for a collective 27 years in the Marine Corps, the Air Force, and the National Guard, attaining the rank of Senior Master Sergeant. He held many roles in The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, where his faith and dedication were an inspiration to all who knew him. He was a constant beacon in the lives of his family, ever-present for his adoring wife, LuJean Morgan (Despain), their five children, Lee, Linda (Ron), Patty (Jeff), Jackie (Kelly), and Clay (Julie), and his 67 grand-, great-, and great-great-grandchildren.

Stan had many jobs throughout his life, from radar technician to air traffic controller and even dump-truck driver, but in his free time, Stan was a master woodworker. He spent countless hours honing, sanding, and polishing pens, bowls, and other beautiful wooden pieces. Stan was also an avid reader, a lover of puzzles, crosswords, and Western movies (anything with John Wayne), and a fan of his personal hero, Charlton Heston. Stan loved classical music and was a lifetime violinist who passed his talent on to his family.
