With deep sadness, we announce the passing of Stephen Tighe Sinclair who left us on June 17, 2024 at age 57 years old. Steve was born on September 3, 1966, to William and Joyce Sinclair in Oklahoma City. Steve spent his formative years in Oklahoma, Alaska, Colorado, Connecticut, Louisiana and Texas where he earned an Electrical Engineering degree from the University of Texas in 1988.

Steve's engineering career spanned 20 years in Houston and 14 years in Salt Lake City, where he was involved in the design and construction of large projects, primarily in the oil and gas industry.
