Teri grew up on the avenues in Salt Lake City, Utah. She spent her summers living on the ranch of her grandparents, in Round Valley, in Rich County, Utah. She really enjoyed all of the time she was able to spend with Grandma Kearn and with her cousins.

She always loved handcrafts, and became quite an artist at sewing, embroidery, cross-stitch, knitting, crocheting, quilting, and the somewhat rare skill of tatting.

Teri was a great genealogy enthusiast and very involved in temple work.

She was a graduate of Salt Lake City's East High School, and of Brigham Young University. Teri also attended the University of Utah before transferring to BYU. She was an elementary education major and was on the NCAA competition synchronized swimming teams at both schools.

She loved children and always wanted to be a teacher. For her student teaching at BYU, she worked in the elementary school in Montezuma Creek, Utah. After graduation and certification, she had a full-time teaching position in Roosevelt, Utah.

Teri was then called to serve in the Spain Seville Mission of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and thoroughly enjoyed her time as a missionary.

When she got home from Spain she taught again, briefly, in Roosevelt but then got a new position at a school in Lyman, Wyoming.

But Teri felt that she should go to California, so she soon started looking for a position there. She has always liked smaller towns and we all expected that to happen in California. We were very surprised when she said she was moving to Sacramento.

What a wonderful decision she made! It was definitely inspired. It became a great blessing for her and for the many people she worked with in those schools – but mostly in the Nong Shala (Hmong-speaking) Ward. Teri was able to teach scores of children over nearly 40 years of involvement there. We constantly heard her tell us about, “my kids” who had gone on missions, and married, and grew to be such good friends to her.

Our family can't say enough good about Teri's other family in Nong Shala. What great people!

She is sorely missed.
