She was a breast cancer survivor. In 1999, her two sisters, Brigitte and Christa, came to live with her to lighten her load. They were a great source of comfort to each other. She found great joy in her garden and feeding the birds that always frequented her beautiful yard and garden. She was a great mother and a wonderful sister. The last few months of her life were filled with her kids and her sister taking care of her. It was well worth the effort she made to be with them those last few months.
