She spent most of her childhood in Riverton. The family lived in Southern California for a few years during the 1930's. Her grandfather worked for the railroad, so she enjoyed several trips between California and Salt Lake on the train. She spent most of her high school years at Jordan High School but graduated from Bingham High School in 1943.

After retirement, she worked at Sandy City and Salt Lake County. She also worked at the West Jordan Jr. High School for two years.

When Henry retired, they were able to spend time in Quartzsite, Arizona during the winter months. They enjoyed the warmer weather and the many activities available and made many friends there.

She was a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, working mostly in the Young Women and Relief Society.

She was a beautiful seamstress. She started making her own clothes in the 7th grade. She made all the dresses for her three girls, including prom dresses. Later she started knitting dish cloths and kept the family and friends supplied. She enjoyed yard work and always had a beautiful yard. She made friends everywhere she went and had many special friends in Santaquin.
