She remembered as a young girl, many church activities and how thrilled she was to attend the dedication of the Los Angeles Temple, where she would eventually be married. Music was an important part of her family culture and some of her favorite childhood memories included singing with her brothers when relatives visited and harmonizing in the car on family trips. She attended the same high school where they filmed the movie "Grease" and was voted Homecoming Queen. She loved serving in student leadership as Senior Vice President and member of many clubs, including Girls League.
