



Victor Escobar

November 18, 1929 ~ November 30, 2022

On Wednesday, November 30, 2022, Victor Escobar, beloved husband, and father, passed away. Victor was 93 years old, having just celebrated his birthday a few days previously.

Victor, known by his sisters as “Vito”, was born November 18, 1929, in Santa Ana, California to Anselmo Escobar and Alta Gracia Durón. He was the fifth of ten children and the oldest living son.

Victor served his country during the Korean War, stationed in Schofield Barracks, Oahu, Hawaii, receiving an honorable discharge.

Victor was baptized a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in July of 1960. In 1961, he met his wife of 61 years in Provo, Utah, being sealed in the Salt Lake City Temple on June 1, 1962. They eventually moved to San Jose, where they lived for over 43 years and their 4 children - Anya-Lisa, April, Aimeé, and Joseph - were born and raised.

Victor earned both his Bachelor of Arts and Master of Fine Arts from Brigham Young University. He was a public school teacher for almost 50 years, teaching primarily art but also Spanish and ESL.

Victor was a valiant member of The Church of Jesus Christ from the time he was baptized, serving in a variety of capacities throughout his life. His most beloved callings were as a Stake Mission Leader and then his most recent calling as a Stake Patriarch, which he held for the last 27+ years.

All who knew and loved him describe him as gentle, mild, kind, a spiritual giant, a mentor, an ardent reader of the scriptures, and one with unwavering faith in God. He loved to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and was always found sitting next to strangers, testifying of Jesus Christ and the peace and happiness we can find in Him.

Victor is survived by his wife, Dorothy (Dody), and his four children Anya-Lisa, April, Aimeé, and Joseph. Also, surviving are one sister, 13 grandchildren, and 8 great-grandchildren.
