Wallace Eldon Lundberg, known as Eldon, was born to Wallace Colburn Lundberg and Agnes Faith Griffiths on October 11, 1925, in Salt Lake City, Utah. Eldon had one sister, Norma Fae Lundberg. He was raised in Salt Lake City and graduated from East High School. He served in the Navy during World War II and was stationed at Pearl Harbor in Oahu, Hawaii. Upon his return, Eldon put in his papers to serve an LDS mission. He was sent to the Western Canadian Mission. After he returned from his mission, Eldon met his sweetheart, LaWona Mae Black. They married on November 20, 1959, at the Salt Lake City LDS Temple for time and eternity. Eldon attended college while working as a draftsman for Standard Oil. He graduated from the University of Utah with a Bachelor's of Science. He also completed a Master of Arts in Elementary Curriculum and Instruction from Brigham Young University.
