When she woke up the next day she was so elated to see them. Throughout her life the view of the mountains had always been important to her.

She settled in Utah where she met and married her devoted husband, Clinton Dale Bradley (Brad), with whom she shared a beautiful life and raised a family. Waltraut's greatest joy came from her role as a mother as she poured her heart into nurturing and supporting her greatest pride and joy her children.

She was a gifted seamstress, she worked for Pullman Wholesale Tailor for \$0.65 an hour. She also worked for Walker's Bridal Shop, and day care. She loved to sew beautiful clothes for her children, always adding special touches that reflected her meticulous attention to detail.

Her yard was her favorite place to be. She had a special place in her heart for each of her flowers. She was known to be weeding in her yard daily, even when she broke her foot. Neighbors always commented on her flowers and how beautiful her yard was.

Waltraut was a convert to The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, where she found strength and inspiration throughout her life. It was very important to her to raise her children knowing the purpose of Easter. Along with her husband they studied the church for about 1-2 years before they decided to join.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Richard and Magdalene Bauer, her siblings Erwin Richard Bauer, Hedwig Wieck, Gunther Bauer, Gerhard Bauer, Irmgard Stutesman, Erwin Erick Bauer, and Erna Henningsen, and her wonderful son Gerald Bradley.
