Wayne Ashton (Doc) Lloyd, age 92, passed away peacefully in his home surrounded by family on September 3rd, 2024, in Salt Lake City.

He was born on October 4th, 1931, in Salt Lake City, Utah to Henry Harries Lloyd and Lucile Fidkin Ashton.

Wayne graduated from West High School in 1950. While at West he became quite the football player. Although small in stature he achieved All State Lineman as a guard on the offensive line. He loved the game of football and coached his three sons through many seasons of little league football.

He is survived by his children, Brett (Stacey) Lloyd, Mark (Wendy) Lloyd, Spencer Lloyd, Amy Lloyd, Susan (Eugene) Ramak, 10 grandchildren, and 8 great grandchildren.
