



## Wendell Leroy Phillips

*March 9, 1930 ~ September 1, 2024*

After a short illness Wendell Leroy Phillips passed away and reunited with the love of his life Doris on September 1st, 2024.

Wendell loved cars. He would often leave for work in one car and return in a different one. Around the age of 90 he decided he needed to buy the one car he always wanted but never had. It was a brand new Dodge Charger. Another thing he loved to do was move walls to different locations. He would just decide to knock a wall down in one place and put it back up in a different location. He also loved camping with his family and travelling in his motorhome. They were members of a motorhome club and enjoyed travelling across the USA with this group. After he and Doris retired they would take their motorhome south to Nevada and Arizona for the winter months. In the last 15 years, they spent much of their time camping with their family at the property of their children outside of Indianola, UT. He loved his family. They were the most important thing to him. He always treated everyone equally. Daughter or daughter-in-law, son or a son-in-law, grandchild or a step grandchild. They were all equal in his eyes. Wendell was a role model to many and taught us how to be better people and better parents. He was accepting of everyone.

He is survived by 6 children. Larry Phillips (Becky), Kathy Maxfield, Kevin Phillips (Jill), Char Phillips (Wendy Potter), Julie Ford (Terry) and Cindy Herbst (John).
