Bill Scavezze passed away from a stroke and dementia on Friday, April 26, 2024 with his loving wife Linda by his side. Bill was born November 17, 1941, to Arthur S. and Christine Keller Scavezze in Pittsburg, KS.

Bill attended St. Mary's High School and was a star football player. He then attended Kansas State at Pittsburg earning a degree in Psychology/Social Work. He was Sergeant of Arms of his fraternity Pi Kappa Alpha and graduated in 1966.

After college Bill was drafted into the US Army serving as a Field Medic at Ft. Sam Houston and later at Ft Gordon in Augusta GA, where he worked in their Psych Unit assisting with the treatment of returning Vietnam Veterans with PTSD.

Bill loved taking his faithful companions Riley and Max on their daily walks around the neighborhood. Bill was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and great grandfather.
