William John Marshall Dalgliesh, age 85, passed away at home on October 8, 2022. Bill was born in Salt Lake City, Utah on June 11, 1937 to Dr. W. Harold Dalgliesh and the Reverend Betty Dalgliesh.

Bill grew up in Salt Lake City and attended Wasatch Elementary School, Bryant Junior High, and East High School. In 1959, he graduated from Stanford University with a Bachelor of Arts degree and served as a Lieutenant in the U.S. Navy. In 1965 Bill left the Navy and attended the University of Utah Law School where he graduated at the top of his class, received his Juris Doctorate and was an attorney for over fifty-five years in Salt Lake City.

Bill was a beloved husband of 59 years to Judy Paterson, who he met at a family wedding in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, where it was love at first sight. Their strong and loving marriage set the example for their children and for many others.
