Our incredible Ann Lee Taylor Ostler passed away peacefully and gracefully at her home, with her family, from brain cancer on March 24, 2014. She was born June 17, 1960 in Salt Lake City to J. She served the way the Savior served because she loved Him and had complete faith in Him. Her sure knowledge of the Lord's plan allowed her to face her passing with courage, without fear.

Ann cherished the gospel and was a gifted teacher. She served in many Church callings but her favorites always included teaching. She loved the chance to serve with her whole family as Inner-City Missionaries. Ann worshipped often in the temple and she volunteered at the Humanitarian Center. She was an example to many even though she shied away from the spotlight and from doing anything just for the approval of others. She was fiercely independent and had complete integrity.
